# **Association's Overview:**

### Scholarships:

CTCAAi is exceptionally delighted and honored in giving over Fourteen Grants and Nine Scholarships in an amount totaling just over US\$6000.00.

CTCAAi continues to attract and solicit Benevolence in the form of Financial Support for scholarships, Awards, Bursary, etc.. We are extremely grateful and appreciative to our past students who have donated funds to the organization for scholarships. We wish to express our gratitude to several current and repeating donors: Marilyn Barnett, Hope Grant, John Lawrence, Hettie Powell, Mary Guy, Liz Smith, B. Roy Davidson, and Errol Tomlinson.

Ms. Barnett is the Benefactor of Kerr Jarret Gift of Hope (KJGH) Scholarship. We are excited about this 'Gifting' and recognize that this is a sacrifice made out of love to her Alma Mater and a deserving student who will certainly accept it with the true spirit of paying forward. The scholarship is intended for a student of Early Childhood Education and living on K.J. Hall.

Ms. Grant is the Benefactor of The Mary Stewart Bright Futures Scholarship (MSBF). We are elated that Hope was so kind in bearing this gift of love that will benefit a deserving student and her Alma Mater. The beneficiary has to be a past student of Godfrey Stewart High School who will study at CTC.

MS. Powell is the benefactor of the Hettie Powell Sports Award (estab. January 2016, doubled in 2023). Hettie was inspired by the mother of a young basketball player requiring financial assistance to attend College. One Award is intended to support current or prospective students who demonstrate sports talent and wish to pursue a teacher training diploma /degree at Church Teachers' College, Mandeville, Jamaica. The second award is supporting a student from Hanover who is in financial needs.

Ms. Liz Smith - Ken Thaxter Leadership Award (established March 2015 by CTCAAi and adopted and funded by Liz as of 2023); to recognize and support a third year CTC student who has demonstrated strong leadership skills during his /her first two years at the College. It is anticipated that the recipient will continue this behavior in perpetuity. The Award was so named after the Reverend Dr. Kenneth Thaxter who served Church Teachers' College (CTC) as principal and lecturer for more than thirty-one years.

Ms. Mary Guy - Trisha Guy Award (estab. October 2023) donated by Mary Guy to support a current or prospective CTC student who has demonstrated a unique financial need that may continue throughout the College life. The Award was so named after Mary's daughter, Trisha, who went on to higher service in 2023.

Mr. John Lawrence - JSKL Scholarship for Mathematics/Science (estab. January 2024) donated by John Lawrence to support the interest and development of Mathematics and Science students. The initials represent John's named and those of his two daughters, one who pursued Mathematics /Statistics to eventually become an Actuary.

Dr. B. Roy Davidson - The Carol, Clinton, Kathleen Muschett Humanities Award (MHA) is so named after members of the Muschett family inspired by daughter Carol. Caretaker and proposer of the Award is B. Roy Davidson, past student of Church Teachers' College (CTC) and member of the Church Teachers' College Alumni Association Inc. (CTCAAi).

Mr. Errol Tomlinson - Errol Tomlinson Special Award identifies a unique financial need of an extraordinary talented student who could have been denied the opportunity to become a teacher.

CTCAAi is acutely aware of the myriads of financial challenges on campus. We have no doubt that many potentially excellent prospects may have been discouraged from applying to CTC and other tertiary institutions due to the inherited hardships and mountainous cost of post high school education. Thanks to everyone, on and off campus, who help to identify the critical needs.
