Principal's Report to the Alumni Association

Academic Year: August 2024 - April 2025

Introduction

The academic year was celebrated under the theme "Celebrating a Legacy of Excellence: Boldly Meeting the Demands of the 21st Century and Beyond." This coincided with the College's **60th Anniversary**, a milestone that allowed us to reflect on our achievements and recommit to the mission of shaping teachers for Jamaica and the wider Caribbean.

Major Infrastructure and Technological Advancements

- **ICT Expansion**: Over 180 new devices (desktops, laptops, smart boards, projectors) were acquired and distributed across labs, offices, and classrooms.
- Smart & Robotics Labs: State-of-the-art facilities established to strengthen digital learning.
- Chapel & Facilities: Air conditioning installed, multimedia delivery upgraded, and major refurbishments made to offices, residence halls, and common spaces.
- **Brown's Town Campus**: Classroom, office, and bathroom refurbishments completed.

Highlight: The STEM Centre

- The Science/STEM Centre proposal was revised and submitted to the Ministry of Education.
- Joint funding has been approved, and construction is slated to begin in 2026.
- To make way for the Centre, staff cottages will be rebuilt, and an **electrical upgrade valued at \$50 million** (including a campus-wide generator) is planned.
- This Centre represents the College's boldest step into 21st-century teacher education, ensuring future educators are equipped in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

Academic and Programme Growth

- Application submitted for University College status—a historic first among Jamaica's teachers' colleges.
- Ongoing collaborations with Temple University, University of Technology, University of Minnesota, and St. Thomas University.

- Teacher training and professional development expanded through the CTC Institute for Excellence in partnership with HEART Trust.
- More than 900 students are currently enrolled in degree programmes across campuses.

Student Achievements & Engagement

- **Graduation Success**: At the TCJ/UWI graduation, CTC presented the most graduates with the highest number of honours (86 First Class, 106 Upper Second).
- **Debating & Quizzes**: Students excelled in local, regional, and international competitions, including victory at the NCU "On the Point" Debate.
- **Sports**: Netball, football, cricket, swimming, and track & field teams gained recognition at intercollegiate competitions.
- Music & Arts: Establishment of the CTC Steel Orchestra, success at JCDC competitions (winning multiple gold and silver medals), and publication of the annual poetry anthology *Moods!*

Rally of Batch Donations & Alumni Support

- As part of the **60th Anniversary Legacy Projects**, batches across decades participated in the **Rally of Batch donations**, gifting the College with **\$60,000 each**.
- These gifts are funding campus beautification, infrastructure upgrades, and legacy projects such as the **new gate structure and elegant entrance corridor**.
- Alumni-led scholarships continued to impact lives, including:
 - o Carol Muschette-Kirk Scholarship
 - o Bishop Alfred Reid Scholarship
 - Silvin Louise Leslie Scholarship (Batch 24)
 - o CTC Alumni Scholarships through CTCAi STAR Committee grants.

Research, Outreach & Community Service

- Special Education Conference hosted with international partnerships.
- Intervention programmes reached students with special needs through the Educational Assessment & Intervention Centre.
- Outreach to schools, children's homes, and communities across Manchester and beyond.
- Environmental sustainability projects included coastal cleanups, farming initiatives, and solar energy installation.
